"Because during my three years at the Central, Jane worked as a secretary to keep me. She's taken a holiday for the past year while I've been working but now she wants to find a job she can enjoy. I couldn't, nor would I want to, ask her to just tag along. That would be terrible."

With a name like Hamish Patrick, he must come from Scotland. "But I've spent my life in all sorts of different places. My father is a minister in the Church of Scotland. He's a bit of a gipsy, and we lived in Guernsey, Nassau and Canada before Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania."

Patrick is the eldest of four children. "My parents made no demands on us at all. We didn't even have to go to church. I did vaguely think about making a career in it when I was 18 or so because there was something about the simplicity of some of the religious writing that attracted me, but it was a passing thing."
