SALE OF WORK IN AID.

Through the instrumentality mainly of the esteemed Vicar (Rev. W. H. M. Bagley) a new Church Room is to be built at Pilton, Barnstaple, at cost of about £1,000. The room to be erected on the site of the old coffee tavern at the top of the main street, this property having been acquired for £250, which has been borrowed on easy terms. Of the £1,000 required about £450 has already been raised, and with the object of further increasing the funds a Sale of Work was held in the picturesque Vicarage Lawn on Thursday.
